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HOW TO MAKE A SARONG FROM TWO SCARVES



WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Two pashmina-sized scarves

Two reels of thread – in the same colours as your scarves

Pins

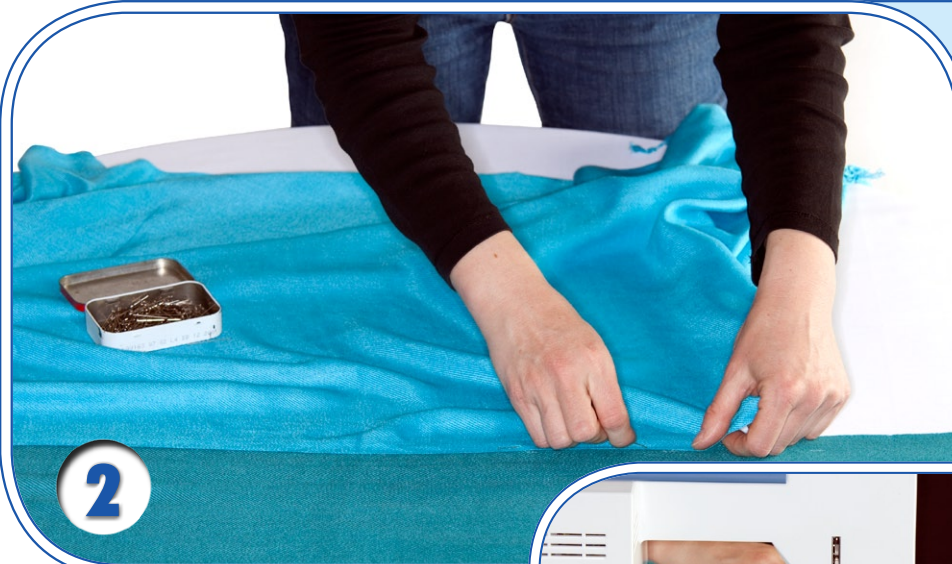
Chalk

Scissors

Sewing machine (or needle and thread)



1 Lay the scarves out on a table. On one of them, mark a line about 2cm in from the long edge.



Lay the other scarf touching the line, so that the two pieces of fabric are overlapping by 2cm. Pin the scarves in place.



Sew a line down the middle of the overlapping strip to join them together.



TOP TIP

If you're using a sewing machine, thread the bobbin with the underneath colour and the needle with the top colour.

Your sarong is finished! Adjust its length by folding over the top edge.
